





 - > GEOANZ #1 conference in Brisbane – circa 200 attendees, \$12k profit after all additional items included (eg keynote speaker dinner, student subsidies, post-Covid cost increases)

 - > unsuccessful in bidding for 2026 XIII International Conference on Geosynthetics (ICG)
 - > successful in bidding for GeoAsia 8 in mid-2025
- > ACIGS has applied for 2023 IGS funding support for Educate the Educators + Pacific Island event

The International Geosynthetics Society (IGS) is a not-for-profit organisation which was founded in Paris, on 10 November 1983, by a group of geotechnical engineers and textile specialists. The Society brings together individual and corporate members from all parts of the world, who are involved in the design, manufacture, sale, use or testing of geotextiles, geomembranes, related products and associated technologies, or who teach or conduct research about such products.

Membership of IGS is primarily organised through national Chapters. There are currently 43 country chapters with over 3,000 individual members and over 500 student members. Most individual members (94%) belong to the IGS through Country Chapters.

The Australasian Chapter commenced in 2002. It is a not for profit organisation which relies on the support and contribution from its members. The board and committee members volunteer their time and support and are committed to supporting the objectives of the society and its members.



